I would like to thank all our RiteCare partners for your work in 2008 and the professionalism you are known for in providing high-quality services to your RiteCare kids and their families. The Board of Trustees and I are committed to supporting you to the maximum extent possible. We greatly appreciate the work you do with the children who have or are at-risk for language disorders.

While the past year has been especially challenging for all not-for-profit organizations - as well as practically everyone else - the Scottish Rite Foundation has sought to minimize the depressed market's impact on our investments. We are blessed with having a very astute and committed Board of Trustees led by The Honorable Stephen M. Munsinger and a Finance Committee led by the Foundation's Treasurer and Trustee, Lee E. Schlessman. This committee actively monitors the Foundation's investments and works closely with its investment advisors to produce the most optimal results possible.

In addition to this hands-on management of our investments, we continue to place strong emphasis on fundraising. In 2008 the Foundation received more than \$753,000 in cash gifts. Sixty-five percent came from estate bequests and the balance resulted from various fund raising activities.

At the September 15, 2008, annual program for the Scottish Rite Foundation at Denver Consistory, the four 2008 graduate scholarship recipients were presented with scholarship certificates. In addition, we were pleased to present RiteCare Partner Awards to our eleven care-giving partners in recognition of their work in serving Colorado's children and their families. The Board of Trustees also honored Norm and Juanita Hoff for their faithful service to the Foundation by presenting them with the Foundation's Distinguished Service Award.

The last item of business during the September program came with the assembling of the seven Foundation Trustees on stage to recognize Deborah Hayes' 25 years of service to the Foundation. Deborah was joined on stage by her husband, Jim Martin. Board President Steve Munsinger presented her with the Foundation's highest award, the Honors of the Foundation. I had the pleasure of reading a Letter of Commendation signed by Governor Bill Ritter. This was followed by a special choral presentation from the cast of the 22nd Degree of the Scottish Rite and a final vocal number "sung" by Valerie Hernandez and myself entitled "Thanks for the Memories."

Finally, I would like you to know that one of our seven trustees, James L. Nunn, recently retired from the Board of Trustees. We presented Jim with our Distinguished Service Award at the September meeting. In December the Board unanimously elected Karl J. Hinkle to take Jim's place on the Board. Karl is a Scottish Rite Mason in Colorado Springs. He is a Certified Public Accountant and the Director of Finance for a manufacturing company in Colorado Springs. We look forward to his participation as a Trustee. You can meet him at February's annual luncheon at The Children's Hospital.


As always, I look forward to working with you in 2009 and wish you every success in your work and life.


The Children's Hospital-Colorado: 25 years of Leadership Recognized Submitted by: Valerie Hernandez, Scottish Rite Program Assistant

We received a kind donation of \$50.00 from Wal-Mart for the purchase of books. Scholastic Book Club also provided us a discount on books that we purchased from them for this event.






