Happy New Year!

I always enjoy the start of a new year. I anticipate revitalizing all those projects that languished in the past year and look forward to starting new ones. The days are getting longer, and spring is on the horizon. Fresh starts and brighter days...

Almost one year ago, I announced my intention to retire (after 40 years as an audiologist and 30 years working with the Scottish Rite Foundation!) as soon as a suitable transition to a new Chair could occur. So ... why am I still here? I thought you'd appreciate learning about the nuances of the search for the new Chair.

The Chair position is a faculty position at the *University of Colorado, School of Medicine*. To meet the University's requirements, a search committee was formed consisting of School of Medicine faculty as well as relevant hospital administrators and community leaders, in this case, the Board of Trustees of the *Scottish Rite Foundation of Colorado* represented by Vernon Ingraham, Executive Secretary. The position was posted within the University system as well as advertised nationally on the *American Speech-Language-Hearing Association* (ASHA) and the *American Academy of Audiology* (AAA) websites.

By August 2013, three candidates who met the minimal requirements of a doctoral degree in either audiology or speech-language pathology had applied. One candidate was ruled out due to limited pediatric experience and one candidate withdrew and to accept a promotion at his current employment setting. The third candidate visited Children's and the University in a two-day interview process which included a presentation of her research/clinical interests to hospital staff, Scottish Rite Foundation representatives, and interested faculty. This candidate was not offered the position so the search continues.

In January, two candidates were interviewed for the position. If one of these candidates is "the right one", then the transition in leadership will begin as soon as that individual can relocate to the position. I am committed to staying briefly to orient the new Chair to the Scottish Rite Foundation, the Children's Hospital, and the University of Colorado, School of Medicine. If we are not successful in recruiting either of these candidates, then the search will continue until the right person is found.

In the interim, please be assured that I am committed to the Scottish Rite Foundation and our RiteCare Programs throughout the state to ensure our continued success in 2014!
