Radio and Television Spot Announcement Airing in May

During May 2017 our spot announcements are airing on various radio and television stations throughout the state. We are using the same spots that were aired last September. Each station is provided with 15 and 30-second spots for television and 15, 30, and 60-second spots for radio. The spots are produced in English as well as in Spanish.

This program is a joint project of the Scottish Rite Foundation of Colorado and the Colorado Broadcasters Association. The September 2016 spots, aired in English and/or Spanish, are summarized as follows:

1,835 radio spots in 26 communities on 78 radio stations.

500 television spots in four communities (Colorado Springs, Denver, Grand Junction, & Pueblo) on 20 television stations.

Scottish Rite Foundation Community Benefit Grant Provides Educational Lecture Series in Pueblo

April 18th kicked off the first of four planned lectures to benefit the community of Pueblo thanks to the generous grant from the Scottish Rite Foundation of Pueblo. The one-hour lecture was titled Identify the Signs: Red Flags and First Steps; it targeted developmental milestones and red flags for speech, language, and feeding disorders, and the first steps to making referrals and where to get help. The lecture was attended by 20 members of the community that included: in-home child care providers, day care center providers, members from early intervention, head start and health department early childhood programs. All attendees received a resource packet that included handouts for various speech language disorders as well as a resource and contact sheet for services in the community.

All feedback on the survey provided at the end of the lecture was very positive and suggestions were made for future lectures. Tentative future lectures for 2017 include Picky Eaters, Early Literacy and Phonological Awareness Strategies and Language Stimulation Techniques.

The grant was awarded to Kathryn Duren, MA CCC-SLP of Children's Colorado Pueblo and she and Amy Clark MS CCC-SLP presented the first lecture.



Our daughter Hazel was a recipient of the Scottish Rite Foundation Scholarship to CU's Child Learning Center program this year, and I am writing to express our gratitude for the support. She was a student in the Toddler Program and it was a fantastic opportunity to expose her to school at an early age.

We were, at first, hesitant to take part in the program because it meant we needed to rearrange our childcare schedule, also sort out a new budget, because we use a nanny who has a set salary. It was an additional expense and an additional hassle and we definitely weighed it over a few times. When she was awarded a scholarship, that took the burden of deciding based on money out of the equation. It made the decision much easier.

We are so glad it did, too, because it has been such a wonderful program for Hazel. She has learned how to interact with her peers through turn taking, her language has moved from a few signs to lots of words and sounds, and she signs the songs she learns at school at home. She also loves the routine and now equates washing her hands with eating snack. One of her favorite signs is friends, which she learned and now associates with going to school.

The Children's Speech and Reading Center

The Scottish Rite Foundation is a very valuable asset to the Northern Colorado community and its children in need of speechlanguage therapy. The Scottish Rite Foundation makes it possible for many families to access the programs at Children's Speech and Reading Center that they would not be able to afford if it was not for their generous support.

In 2016, Children's Speech and Reading Center provided:

- 344 free speech-language screenings of which 161 were in-house (Ft Collins and Loveland Offices) and 183 screenings offsite in eleven (11) local pre-schools also located in Fort Collins and Loveland.
- 51 children with pre-literacy program funded by the SRF, at the Teaching Tree Centers in Fort Collins and Loveland, and at the Thompson Pre-School in Loveland.
- 4,492 individual with one-on-one speech-language and reading therapy sessions to 249 children. Fifty-six (56) of those children were covered by SRF funding and received a total of 1,235 one-on-one sessions

Of the 249 children served by CSRC in 2016,

- 26.4% were non-SRF sliding scale fee
- 22.5% were SRF sliding scale fee
- •
- 20.9% were full fee clients
- •
- 30.2% were covered by Medicaid



Without CSRC, and its ability to provide services on a sliding scale fee structure and the Scottish Rite Foundation financial support, many low-income families would not be able to access our therapy services. Currently, approximately 80% of CSRC clients qualify for reduced fee services. Support from SRF, and other donors and foundation helps CSRC fill in the gap in services for these children that might otherwise fall through the cracks, by delivering specialized therapy services on a sliding scale fee basis.
